Leadership Changes

To keep our membership updated, there are a number of changes occurring within our chapter leadership at this time. First of all, Kathy Clerkin, our longtime Membership chair, is stepping down and will not be active in our chapter in the future. Mike Lex, our Biking co-chair, is also stepping down due to other pressing commitments. We thank them for their service and wish them well!



The other major changes involve the recent adoption of the new bylaws by the main club. The old board of directors' structure, where each chapter elected a director and alternates, is being transformed into a smaller board consisting of members recruited for their expertise in specific areas, such as finance or hospitality.

To provide a mechanism for chapters to have input at the state level, a new advisory council is being formed, which will be made up of a trustee from each chapter. Several representatives from the advisory council will then serve on the new board of directors.



The exact details of the new advisory council and the trustee positions are yet to be determined. In the meantime, many chapters are having their existing director transition to serve as the trustee. Kate Hacker, one of our alternate directors, has been serving on the board of directors since Rob Laing resigned his position as director last fall. Kate has volunteered, has been appointed as our chapter trustee and will represent us on the new advisory council through the end of her original term ending in December 2021.



Cheryl Peluso has been serving as our other alternate director. Now that the positions of director and alternates are being phased out, we thank Rob, Cheryl, and Kate for their past service, and Kate for accepting this new role.

Our nominating committee has been working diligently to recruit members to run for chapter chair and outings chair at our upcoming election during the online business meeting in June. They have also been seeking someone to volunteer to be appointed to serve as program chair for the duration of the open term, which ends in August 2022. It appears that they have found candidates for all three positions. Stay tuned for further information!

Please note that we will operate under the same guidelines established July 2020 to remain as safe as possible during this pandemic. A brief overview is listed below:

- Day trips ONLY. Overnight outings are prohibited.
- Outings are limited to a maximum of 10 participants.
- Participants must contact the leader and register in advance.
- Carpooling and spotting of cars are not allowed. Participants from different households are to provide their own transportation.
- The trip plan may not include eating in restaurants prior to or after the outing. Purchasing food from take out windows, such as ice cream stands, is allowed.
- All participants must carry sanitizer/ (or) soap and face masks, and review the following mask use rules.
- Masks are to be readily accessible so that they may be donned quickly when needed. Masks must be worn when within 6 feet of others, especially at busy trailheads and parking areas, public restrooms, when passing others on a trail, at a destination such as a summit, pond, or other attraction, and when stopping at rest areas, gas stations, and other crowded areas.
- Participants from different households are not to share equipment, food, or drinks. They need to maintain physical distancing of 6 feet or more from members of other households.
